

Graph Curves, Not Curves, Put Love On Scientific Basis

Johnny Doughboy, Joe College, marry," Dr. Adams said, "but we and their girls can now look before they leap into marriage, for statistics tell them whether they will make suitable mates.

In a service set up at the College, Dr. C. R. Adams, associate professor of education and psychology, finds that he can tell a true love case and predict the probable success of the marriage by statistical curves.

The "marriage clinic," believed to be the first on any college campus in the country, serves 200 to 300 unmarried couples and helps straighten out the domestic tangles of approximately 50 married couples a year.

When a couple comes to find out whether they are in love or are too different to marry, Dr. Adams gives them the Terman prediction test for marital happiness and the Adams-Lepley personal audit test for personality traits. If scores are low, he supplements these with the Burgess-Cottrell marital prediction scale.

Statistical curves are plotted from the scores, and if the curves follow each other closely it is a true love case. If the scores fail to plot well, the attraction is probably on a physical basis only and won't last too long. However, personal factors such as length of acquaintance, length of engagement, economic status, and age are also considered.
