Organization Coordinates All Religions on Campus

An Inter-Faith Council is being organized by the Penn State Christian Association, Jane Cromis and Richard Gillespie, co-chairmen of Commission III, stated today.

The council will represent all the faiths on the campus and in the community. The purpose of the group will be to coordinate religious activities on the campus.

Commission III, which deals with religious emphasis, has most of the details of the council completed. Only final arrangements remain before the group will go into operation.

The commission also plans to hold Lenten services at one of the churches in town around Easter. Four or five afternoon services are planned by the PSCA. Last year the services were held at the St. Paul's Methodist Church.

During the past year Commission III was responsible for numerous programs and services held on the campus. It sponsored worship services Thanksgiving night at Schwab Auditorium for the first time in the history of the school.

Around Christmas the commission held morning watch services at 7:20 a.m. for four weeks. The practice was begun many years ago by the Christian Association.

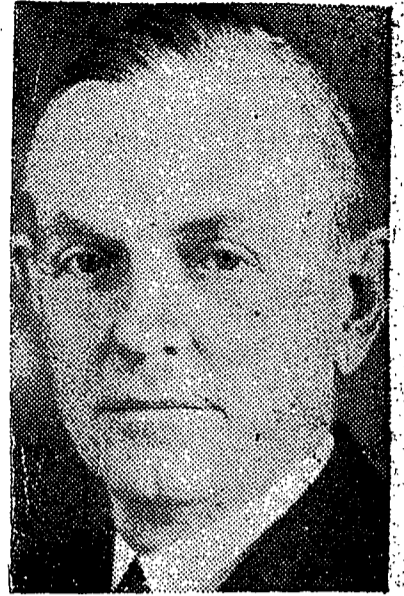
Commission III started something new this year when it staged New Year watch services on New Year's eve in the Hugh Beaver room. This service will be continued next year because of its popularity.

At the present time Sunday vesper services are being planned for the students and servicemen. Richard Gillespie hopes to hold the services in the Little Theater in the near future.

These services were held earlier in the semester, but complications arose over the Christmas vacation which have made it impossible to hold them for a few weeks.

The commission also has a library of religious books at the Christian Association office, 304 Old Main, which may be taken out by students. Pamphlets and papers on worship also are on file at the office.

Forty students representing the Student Christian Movement of Canada and many students from other foreign countries also attended the conference.

The importance of this gathering was evident in the daily discussions, which emphasized the gigantic problems facing the Christian students with regard to post-war planning.
