Present first semester seniors wishing to make any room changes may do so by coming to the southeast lounge of Atherton Hall, 7:15 p.m. Wednesday. Present first and second semester juniors wishing to make room changes may do so by coming to the northeast lounge of Atherton, 7:15 p.m. Wednesday. First and second semester sophomores wishing to make room changes should come to the southeast lounge in Atherton, 7:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Second semester freshmen who would like to move to an upper-class dormitory should come to the northeast lounge of Atherton, 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, for numbers drawing. However, all second semester women wishing to be moved may not be able to be accommodated, and a number of these coeds will be permitted to remain in freshman dormitories where they are now living.

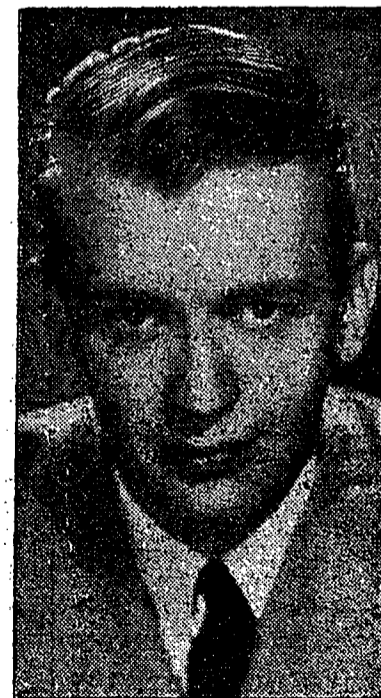
