

Representatives Discuss Serviceman Counseling

Representatives of the College regularly responsible for counseling students will meet with those responsible for religious counseling in symposium to discuss principles and methods of group and individual counseling of servicemen, Arthur R. Warnock, Dean of Men, announced.

The symposiums, sponsored by the Committee on Recreation and Welfare, will be held in Room 104 Old Main, 7:30 to 9 p.m. every Thursday.

The symposium Thursday will be a panel discussion on "What Chaplains and Military Commanders Learn About Service Men." Those heading the panel will be Lt. Col. G. G. Mills, Comdr. W. S. Gabel, Maj. T. E. Leet, Lt. J. A. McClintock, and Chaplain C. F. Lauer. They will discuss incipient problems of individual and group morale, homesickness, worries, infractions of regulations, and needs for a confidential adviser.

"Identifying Maladjustments and Dealing with Them" will be the title of the symposium March 2, and a panel discussion March 9 will be on "Discussions Yielding Ideas and Attitudes that Men Live By."

A well known Philadelphia athlete, Lt. Kubler is a graduate of Villanova and of the Temple University medical school. He won letters in track, football, and basketball at Roman Catholic High School and was a guard on the Villanova team that defeated Penn State at Beaver Field in 1936. This victory marked Villanova's only triumph over Penn State.

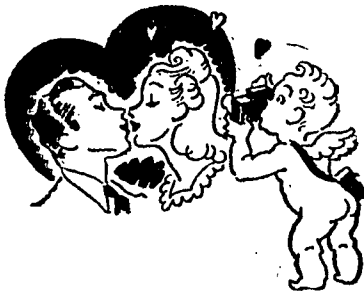
