# Election Changes Pass Committee

(Continued from page one) meeting following the succeeding election.

**Article II Section 2:** The Cabinet Chairman shall be the president of the eighth semester. At such time as the office of eighth semester president shall be vacated due to graduation the office of Cabinet Chairman shall devolve upon the seventh semester president until the succeeding election.

**Article III Section 2:** The Student Tribunal shall be composed of not less than five and not more than eight members, appointed by the Cabinet Chairman by and with the consent of the Cabinet, two of whom shall be appointed from the eighth semester and the remaining appointments be apportioned among students of the 5th, 6th and 7th semesters.

**Section 8:** Attendance at hearings of the Tribunal shall be limited to men students unless otherwise deemed by that day.

(Sections 8 and 9 become Sections 9 and 10 respectively.)

**Article V Section 4:** Each active School Council shall be entitled to elect one representative to the All-College Cabinet. He shall represent his Council in an ex-official capacity.

**Article VI Section 2:** The eighth semester treasurer shall be the Interclass Finance Chairman. At such time as the office of eighth semester treasurer shall be vacant due to graduation, the seventh semester treasurer shall become Interclass Finance Chairman until the succeeding election.

In order to insure a successful Red Cross program, plans are being made for a Red Cross dance to be given sometime this month. The proceeds will be turned in towards the drive.

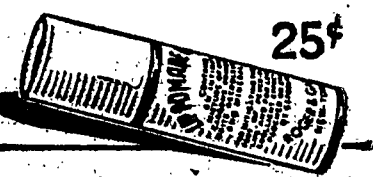
