"Because The Human Family Is One" has been announced as the theme of the annual conference of the Student Christian Movement to be held at Camp Kanestake, Spruce Creek, June 5 to June 12.

Topics of discussion during the conference will be "The Christian Understanding of Human Unity," "Social Forces Supporting and Resisting Human Unity," "Personal and Group Christian Action for Human Unity."

Students and faculty members from colleges and universities from New Jersey to West Virginia will participate in these discussions, worship, addresses, and forums throughout the week.
