## Iowa University Bestows Engineer Degree On Prof

Frank W. Edwards, assistant professor of civil engineering at the College, has been awarded the professional degree of civil engineer by the University of Iowa in recognition of his professional experience and paper on the hydraulic design of the Conchas Dam in New Mexico.

Tests of a model dam which were the basis of the study, were conducted by Edwards in the U. S. Waterways Experiment Station at Vicksburg, Mississippi.

Edwards came to State College last September from North Carolina, where he had been senior engineer in charge of planning all army cantonments and airfields in the U. S. Engineer District of Wilmington. For that work he was awarded the Army Service Forces' commendation for meritorious civilian service. For three years he was chief of hydraulic design and research for the Third Locks project of the Panama Canal and he has had other professional experience in hydro-electric power flood control, navigation and irrigation work in the United States.

He is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and is co-author of a paper on surges in The Panama Canal which is currently under discussion in the proceedings of the Society.

The July issue of Portfolio will be on sale at Student Union on Friday, June 30, when students will return to register for the summer semester.

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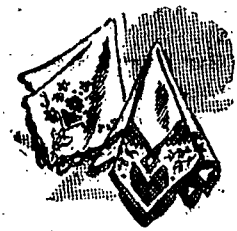

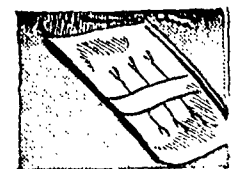
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
