Professor Nevins, the historian, has returned from Australia with the report that Australia is looking forward to the post-war era when she is preparing to take her place as a major Pacific power.

South America saw the further entrenchment of a Fascist dictatorship in Argentina, and at the same time a rise in the tide of revolt against dictator presidents in El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua.

At the moment the balance sheet is one of confusion in recording our gains and losses. President Roosevelt announced he would accept the renomination "reluctantly, but as a good soldier—"
