P-51 Fighter Pilot

A flight leader and pilot for a P-51 fighter squadron of the Tenth Air Force that fights the Japs over Burma, the newly-decorated officer has 81 combat missions and 222 combat hours to his credit. He is also credited with five enemy planes destroyed during his year's service in the China-Burma-India theater.
