

# Booters Seek Win After Navy Defeat

Smarting from an unexpected defeat by a strong Navy team, 2-1, Saturday, Coach Bill Jeffrey's Lion soccer squad is practicing long hours and revamping its lineup in order to prove a vicious host to the Muhlenberg team it will entertain behind the east stands of New Beaver Field at 1:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

Starting for the Jeffrey men at goalie will be either Gene Graibner playing his last game for Penn State, or Joe Crouch, erstwhile halfback who is expected to take over the post when Graibner leaves. Freshman Dave Binns has clinched the spot at right fullback while Clair Jewell and Charley Appleman are fighting for the nod at left full.

At right halfback Coach Jeffrey will field Stet Stetler or Capt. Jimmy Atherton. A newcomer competing for this position is Jack Campbell, a first semester freshman who will matriculate at the College today and may play on the varsity tomorrow. Jess Hartman and Bob Parker will hold down their usual positions of center and left halfbacks.

On the forward line Red Pavlika or Karl Erdman will be Jeffrey's choice at outside right. Herb Mendt or Jim Atherton will hold down the inside right and inside left positions. John Hamilton or Red Pavlika will start at center forward and to complete the roster Fritz Holmquist has been selected to play at outside left.

Coach Jeffrey is not too worried over the prospects of the Muhlenberg game. The Mules have lost all three of their starts, 1-0, to Princeton; 2-1, to Bucknell; and 2-0, to Temple, he said.

Although Marine First Lt. Ned Corman, former Penn State soccer star, has completed 95 combat missions in the Southwest Pacific, he has yet to collect a bullet hole in his plane.

A former member of the famed "Black Sheep Squadron" of which the missing Major Gregory Boyington was leader, Corman has just been awarded the Air Medal for "meritorious achievement" in aerial action against the Japs in the Solomons.

The ex-Lion booter has concentrated on heavily fortified Jap-held Rabaul in his combat flying.

# War Veterans To Swell Hunting Ranks

American youth, returning from the hunting grounds of European battlefields and Pacific island outposts, will constitute the largest army of game hunters in the nation's history, it was predicted today by Dr. P. F. English of the College faculty.

Dr. English, who is associate professor of wildlife management, pointed out that many men who never even held a gun before entering military service have become crack marksmen.

Hundreds of them, he said, have

become accustomed to outdoor life and will turn to hunting as a wholesome recreation and outlet for their pent-up emotions.

"There is no better way for nervous and shell-shocked veterans to calm their troubled nerves than to get out in the fields and mountains," Dr. English believes.

An abundant game supply, fostered by the dearth of wartime hunters, will be waiting when the soldiers come home, Dr. English added. To prevent future

shortages, he advised game commissions and local sportsmen's clubs to pay farmers to let a few rows of grain remain in fields for food.
