Alpha Lambda Delta Taps Prof Voices V-Day Plans

"the dragon seed of future wars" if they adopt any proposal to parcel out parts of the German nation among themselves, Pro-fessor G. J. Wurfl of the College warned today.

Professor Wurfl, former German Imperial army officer whose son is now overseas with the U.S. Army Air Forces, recommended the Reich be ruled by a commission composed of England, the United States, Russia, and Germany itself.

The masses of German people. he explained, follow leaders such as Hitler only because of confusion, fear, and coercion. Democracy, he believes, could be successfully established with allied help.

"Even if the allies maintained military rule in Germany for the Monday and Tuesday, November next 50 years," the German professor emphasized, "only chaos could result from a plan for dismemberment."

Such dismemberment, he added, would so anger and humiliate the German people that they once again would turn to thoughts of war, and would commission their scientists to go to their laboratories and seek news ways to


