New Interfraternity Dating Code Approved By Senate Committee

The following Interfraternity Dating Code for 1944-45 has been approved by the Senate Committee on Student Welfare, Prof. Laura W. Drummond, chairman, announced:

1. A social fraternity shall be considered throughout this resolution to consist of a group of fraternity men of at least 10 members, including pledges, living together in a house, the whole of which, not a unit such as an apartment, is owned or rented by the social fraternity, and is operated by the fraternity's members.
2. Women guests are to be allowed only on the first floor except in houses where specific exceptions are made by the Dean of Men, the Dean of Women, and in no case in the rooms of men.
3. A living room or clubroom where women guests may be entertained must be provided which is well lighted by three or more lamps, and at least two couples must be present.
4. All social functions such as dances and parties held in the fraternity house must be chaperoned. The chaperones must be approved one week in advance of the function by the Dean of Women.
5. All women guests must leave the fraternity house by 8 p.m. every night excepting Friday and Saturday nights when they must leave by 12:30 p.m. and Sunday night when they must leave by 10 p.m.
6. No alcoholic beverages of any kind shall be served on fraternity premises at any time when women are present.
7. The president and social chairman of the fraternity, or two chosen representatives where more than one group lives in the fraternity house, shall be held responsible for the actions and conduct of the members of that fraternity or house for their entire term of office. Should either or both of these

officers be absent, it is their duty to appoint someone to act in their place during their absence. The names of the two men so placed in responsibility for any social function shall be filed in the office of the Dean of Women by 8 a.m. Friday preceding the social function.

8. Any known violation shall be reported to the Interfraternity Council Judicial Committee consisting of the faculty advisor, the President, and three members of the IFC, and that group shall hold a meeting for the violating fraternity. The decision of that committee shall be final.
9. Proven violations of these provisions will exclude the fraternity found guilty, by trial, from the privileges of this code, or any of the privileges put forth and stipulated in any other code under IFC ruling. Reinstatement can be made only by petition and acceptance by the IFC Judicial Committee after an indefinite period of time. Judicial Committee shall refer the matter to the Senate Committee on Student Welfare with whom the ultimate decision of reinstatement shall rest.
10. Any group of men living together in quarters not under the jurisdiction of IFC shall be regulated by the Student Welfare Committee.
11. Any fraternities that entertain women guests must keep a guest list. This list, which shall include the name of the man, the woman, and the date, is to be handed in to the Dean of Men's Office by noon the following Monday. It is to be sealed. This list should include all women guests, whether coeds or not.
12. Coeds must indicate on their sign-out sheet in the dormitories that they were guests at a fraternity house. If they fail to do so, they shall be held directly responsible. Action will be taken at the discretion of WSGA and the office of the Dean of Women.
13. This code must be placed on the fraternity bulletin board or some other obvious place for reference at all times.
14. We hereby resolve that the members of IFC present at the meeting on November 30, 1944, shall in all sincerity adhere to the above resolution and will to the best of their ability obey all rules and regulations of this code.

DR. STEPHEN S. WISE

PSCA, Hillel Offer Dr. Wise Lecture

"If I Were a Christian" will be Dr. Stephen S. Wise's theme at a PSCA and Hillel Foundation sponsored lecture in Schwab auditorium at 8 p.m. Tuesday.

Dr. Wise is rabbi of the Free Synagogue, New York, president of the Jewish Institute of Religion, and president of the American and the World Jewish Congresses. Born in Budapest, Dr. Wise has been active in Jewish life in the German speaking lands of Europe. He was one of the founders of the Zionist movement, and was founder of the Zionist Organization of America in 1898. He served as president of this organization from 1936 to 1938 and was its representative at the Versailles Peace conference. He also served as chairman of the United Palestine Appeal.

The Rabbi has been active in religious, educational, and civic work in the city of New York and throughout the country. He was one of the founders of the American Jewish Congress and the Jewish Institute of Religion school for the training of men for the Jewish ministry and for leadership in the field of education and social service.

A graduate of Columbia University, Dr. Wise has received numerous honorary degrees. He is editor of "Opinion," a monthly journal of Jewish life and letters, and the author of several books.



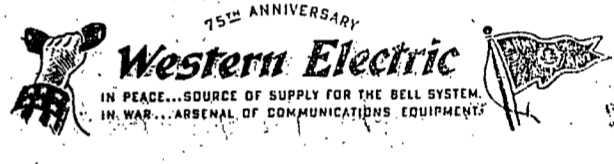
Nerve Systems for Battle Wagons

'Giving Blood Is Easy' Says Coed, Following Thirteenth Donation

Thirteen wasn't the jinx for Natalie Lerner—she survived her thirteenth trip to the Red Cross Blood Bank, and is planning to donate her fourteenth pint of blood during the Christmas vacation.

Dark-haired, dark-eyed Natalie gave her first pint of blood in April, 1942, at Temple University. "I was petrified the first time, and even scared a little the second, but it doesn't hurt at all," she admits. "For first two pints were donated at the Temple unit, and the following eleven at the Philadelphia Blood Bank."

After she had offered her eighth pint, the coed was admitted to the "Gallon Club." Other recognition she has received include the bronze pin for the first pint, a silver pin for the third pint, and a red ribbon, to be attached to the silver pin, for the eighth pint. A present she is aiming for the red and white ribbon, signifying sixteen pints.

When Natalie first went to the blood bank in 1942, she was slightly anemic, but with a little persuasion she was accepted. Today, she believes the doctors in charge are much more strict, as they won't accept people who have a slight cough.

Natalie has never been sick as a result of her donations. Therefore, she says, "There's nothing to be afraid of. I don't understand why everybody doesn't do it."
