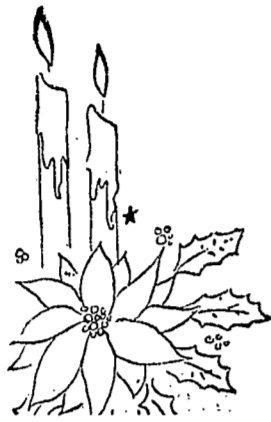

WSGA Exceeds Goal Of Christmas Drive

WSGA has exceeded its goal of \$450 in its annual Christmas drive, announced Mary Margaret Dunlap, chairman of the drive. All donations have not been collected, but a total of at least \$500 is expected, which will make this the most successful drive ever conducted.

Sparking the drive are Katherine Fix, publicity chairman, and Rose Deyvecka, who directed the advertising of the drive through posters.

The donations will be divided among three projects to which WSGA has made its annual contribution for five years. These projects are the Mifflin County Children's Aid Society, American Women's Hospitals, and Mrs. Helzel's fund for emergencies.

Frosh Women Nominate For WSGA Senate Posts

What Is AAUW?

"What is AAUW?" is a question often heard from puzzled students who find these four initials used in some Collegian news item or listed along with the more common abbreviations as WRA, WSGA, ISC, IWA, SU, IMA, IFC, and others.

AAUW or the American Association of University Women is a national organization of collegiate alumnae which has been in existence since the early 1880's. The Organization of College Alumnae was its original name.

Founded to further the educational opportunities and responsibilities of women, this group has since broadened its aims. It has demonstrated that a really educated woman is not only active in her own home but also in her community and state. Lately the members of AAUW throughout the nation have been considering the present international situation and the part women will play in the coming world peace.

As its fields of study, the organization lists such subjects as: education, social studies, international relations, creative arts, and legislation. Unique with the State College branch is its efforts towards providing recreation for professional women. Former WSGA Prexy Guards Diets At Mac

From laying down the law for College coeds to counting out the ration stamps for the butcher who delivers the meat to McAllister Hall dining commons has been the recent step forward in the life of Mrs. Carroll Barton, the former Patricia Diener.

Mrs. Barton, former president of WSGA, has been working as an assistant dietitian in McAllister Hall dining-room since July. At present she is supervising the work in the coeds' section of the dining commons. She is in charge of the three men and three coeds employed in that section to help serve and clear the tables.

"I liked State, was fond of the people here, and wanted to work with students," stated Mrs. Barton when asked why she accepted this position just after her graduation in June.

While a student at the College, Mrs. Barton was one of five coeds chosen by the home economics department to spend her seventh semester studying at the Merrill-Palmer Child Development School, Detroit, Mich.

Mrs. Barton started early in campus student government. She was elected a Freshman Senator during her first year at the College, and later was reelected to the position of Sophomore Senator. She served as vice-president of WSGA during her junior year and as a senior was president of that group.

With the Ellen H. Richards Club, Omicron Nu (both home economics honoraries), Cwens, Mortar Board, and Phi Kappa Phi on her list of activities, she was easily selected as an entry in "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities." At commencement exercises, she was again honored when her classmates elected her "Bow Girl."

Her present duties, in addition to supervising the serving of the 202 coeds eating in McAllister Hall, include keeping a record of

all ration points, helping Mrs. Charlotte A. Hazen, the other dietitian at McAllister dining commons, to plan menus, and assisting in the kitchen, pantry, or bakery when necessary.

According to both Mrs. Barton and Miss Ida M. Parent, supervisor of McAllister dining commons, the coeds eating there are very cooperative as are the 360 sailors who eat there at present. At one time the hall served as many as 682 V-12er's at each meal.

"We try to vary our menus so as not to serve the same combinations more than once every three weeks," stated Mrs. Barton, "but it is quite a difficult task because of the amount of juggling the ration points require." She added, "Since I've seen this problem from both sides I feel more sympathetic toward the dietitians' problem, although as a student I too did my share of complaining."
