

### McAndrews' Crew To Meet Army, Bows To Virginia Boxers, 5 1/2-2 1/2

Penn State's boxing team will be out to avenge an early season defeat when it meets a U. S. Military Academy squad at Recreation Hall, 8 o'clock tomorrow. The Cadets came out ahead in the first encounter, 5-3.

Coach Marty McAndrews is starting Alan Pottasch, freshman, in the 155-pound class. Pottasch, formerly a welterweight, will replace Jack Seitchek who has left for the Army. Navy trainee Ben Adelstein will take over in place

of Vaughn Stapleton, who lost decisions at West Point and Virginia.

The Lion mittmen lost their second start Saturday to an under-rated Virginia team, 5 1/2-2 1/2. Nick Ranieri and Capt. Paul Smith won their bouts by decisions and Larry Luhrs remained undefeated by default.

In normal times Penn State competes with intercollegiate opponents in 16 sports.

### Nittany Lion Quintet Faces Carnegie Tech

Coach John Lawther's basketball team will face the Carnegie Tech five in the only game of the week on Recreation Hall floor Wednesday night. Penn State defeated Tech, 52-27, in an away contest earlier this season.

Starting lineup for the Lions will probably be Bill Nugent and Irv Batnick at the guard positions, Slim Currie in the center spot, and Doc Willison and Dick Light as forwards.

### State Matmen Wrestle Navy

Losing to a strong Army squad, 16-12, Penn State wrestlers will travel to Annapolis tomorrow to face a veteran Navy team, undefeated since 1942.

Coach Paul Campbell will pit Capt. Glenn Smith against the Midshipman star, Capt. John Hale, in the 155-pound division. Hale won the Eastern title last season in this division.

George Schautz, 121, will meet Mickey MacDonald who annexed the 1944 Eastern and National championships and was voted the outstanding college wrestler in the country in 1944.

Other grapplers starting for the Lions will be Bob Crease, 128; Steve Greene, 136; Hal Frey, 145; Wishard, 165; Chuck Hall, 175; and Don Miltenberger, heavyweight.

Schautz, Crease, Greene, and Smith won bouts against Army Saturday night to score 12 points against the Cadets, the most tallied against them this season. Army's Lyle Edwards pinned Hall in 7:14 and Joe Stanowicz pinned Miltenberger in three minutes to clinch the meet.

Bucknell University was Penn State's first opponent in football, basketball, and baseball.

Coach Maxie Hannum, seeking to avenge the Skibo's earlier defeat and aiming for another Big Seven victory, has lost two first string men to the Army. They are Leo Clougherty, one of Tech's fastest ball handlers, and Center Mike Theodore.

Rusty Scioscia has been transferred from guard to the center position and Tami Morinello was moved up to the forward position. Vince Fastuca will replace Scioscia as guard while Tasso Katselas and Melvin Klein will complete the squad.

### MIDDIES TRIUMPH, 60-27

The U. S. Naval Academy basketball team chalked up its sixth consecutive victory by swamping the Lion courtmen, 60-27, at Annapolis Wednesday. Coach Lawther's men held the Middies on even terms for the first ten minutes of play, when the score was eight-all, but Navy forged ahead from that point and had won a 24-11 lead by halftime. Doc Willison started in place of Les Szepesi in the tussle.
