**Rochester Pastor To Talk**

"America in the Wake of the War" is the topic Rev. Robert Kazmayer, former pastor of the Monroe Avenue Methodist Church, Rochester, N. Y., has chosen for the subject of his address to the College Chapel congregation Sunday. The Chapel Choir, under the leadership of Mrs. Willa Taylor, will sing.

Rev. William T. Hanzsche, of the Prospect Street Presbyterian Church, Trenton, N. J., will speak in Chapel February 18. According to John H. Frizzell, College Chaplain, Dr. Hanzsche's message, "Flying on the Beam," is particularly suitable for graduating seniors. He, therefore, urges all eighth semester students to make a special effort to attend this service.

That Sunday has been designated as the "World Student Day of Prayer," and several undergraduate students will speak briefly on that subject as a part of the Chapel service.
