"The mountainous landscape here is marvelous, just like my home." With this in mind, Martha Bascope Vargas, Bolivian winner of a Pan-American scholarship, selected Penn State when she was offered a choice of all the colleges in the United States.

In 1942 Martha wrote an essay on "What Inter-American Cooperation Means to My Country," for an inter-American student forum

contest. As grand-prize winner of this contest, Martha came to to minor in journalism, which is Washington, D. C., and eventually a pioneer field for women in her to Penn State to study chemistry. 


