Professor Edits Tune Collection

Old country tunes played by the fiddlers and fifers in southwestern Pennsylvania will be published in a new book by Samuel Bayard, professor of English composition. The book tentatively titled "Hill Country Tunes," will be released later this spring.

With a grant from the American Philosophical Society, Professor Bayard spent a great deal of time studying the folklore of Fayette, Greene, Westmoreland, and other counties in that region of the state. Many of the songs that he lists have been handed down by ear and date back to the settling of Pennsylvania. Nearly all of the tunes in the book can be traced back to England, Scotland, Ireland, or Germany.

In his introduction, the writer describes the country fiddler's technique, such as special tunings for harmonic effects. With each tune he has sketched its history, noted how widespread the tune is, and compiled a list of other published versions of the song.

At present, Professor Bayard is working on a regional anthology of folklore for the entire country in collaboration with the men eminent in this field. Professor Bayard is writing on southwestern Pennsylvania while his co-authors will relate the folklore of the cowboys, the Pennsylvania Dutch, and representatives of other regions of America.
