The INS reporter has received the distinction of being the only woman correspondent accredited to the American Eighth Air Force ir Britain and the only correspondent to do a broadcast over CBS about the flying bombs.

Going abroad in 1942 Miss Tighe is the only woman to make an operational mission in the European Theatre of Operation. She spent 13 hours in the air hunting U-boats.

During her journalistic career she has worked for the Philadelrhia Daily News, New York Daily News, Palm Beach Post, the Paul Block chain, New York Post, and INS. In addition, she has broadcasted for CBS; NBC, and BBC.


Tau Beta Pi Pledges Three Undergraduates


