

## INS War Correspondent, Dixie Tighe, To Lecture

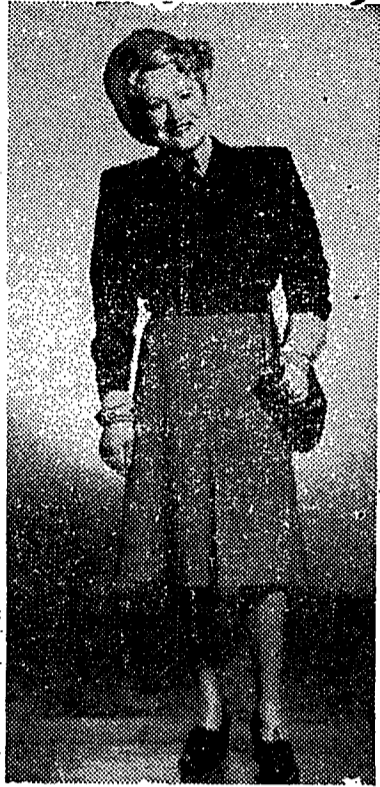
Dixie Tighe, woman war correspondent for International News Service, will speak to journalism students in 121 Sparks at 11 a. m. Monday. The public is invited to attend.

Miss Tighe started her career as a cub reporter in Washington, D. C. She has covered the Lindbergh kidnaping story, the Hauptmann trial, the 1939 visit of King George and Queen Elizabeth, and commando training in Scotland.

The INS reporter has received the distinction of being the only woman correspondent accredited to the American Eighth Air Force in Britain and the only correspondent to do a broadcast over CBS about the flying bombs.

Going abroad in 1942 Miss Tighe is the only woman to make an operational mission in the European Theatre of Operation. She spent 13 hours in the air hunting U-boats.

During her journalistic career she has worked for the Philadelphia Daily News, New York Daily News, Palm Beach Post, the Paul Block chain, New York Post, and INS. In addition, she has broadcasted for CBS, NBC, and BBC.
