Nittany Baseball Team Downs Garnet, Teachers

The Lion baseball team chalked up two more victories this week when it jarred Swarthmore, 9-8, Saturday and downed Bloomsburg Teachers College, 12-2, Wednesday. This credits Coach Joe Bedenk's men with four victories in six starts.

This week the Nittany Lions will play a return game with Pitt at Pittsburgh tomorrow and will face a Villanova nine on New Beaver field at 4 p.m. Wednesday.

Bedenk has sent letterman Glenn Smith into center field and Sonny Griffith into right field, replacing Joe Leith and Dan Williams. Leith has taken over McHale's duties at first base and Don Herb held down the catcher's position in the Bloomsburg tilt.

Penn State started off like an easy winner in the Swarthmore game taking a 7-1 lead at the beginning of the sixth but a Garnet rally produced four runs to which

three more were added before the eighth period.

With the score tied, 8-8, in the last half of the ninth and the bases loaded, relief pitcher Phil Evans walked Smith and forced Andy DeLorenzo, second baseman, home to score the deciding run.

The Lions took an early lead in the Bloomsburg game and were never threatened. They drove home six runs in the second canto, three in the fifth, and singles in the first, third, and eighth.

Captain Joe Tepsic, who hit safely, three for four, in Saturday's tilt, one a three-bagger, and two for four against the Teachers including a home run, leads the Lion batters. Navy trainee Elwood Stetler, left fielder, follows closely in second place.

Lions Outrun Muhlenburg; Try Again in IC-4A Meet

Penn State's track team thoroughly defeated Muhlenburg, 108 to 18, Saturday, taking 13 out of 14 possible first places. Tomorrow the Lion track team will face the best trackmen of other colleges in the IC-4A meet at West Point.

In Saturday's meet Bill Nugent and Bob Steed were both double winners. Nugent won the 440 yard dash in 51.2 seconds and the 220 in 23.2. Steed won the 120 high hurdles in 17.4 seconds and the 220 lows in 26.8 seconds.

Muhlenburg failed to place at all in the 220, 440, half mile, pole vault, and broad jump. Although many times and distances were not too good Saturday, the team will do better at the IC-4A meet than at the Penn Relays, according to Coach George Harvey. At the relays many events were won

by military and athletic club teams, neither of which will run in this meet.

The seven men who will go to West Point, and the events they will take part in follow: Bill Mullins, shot put; Floyd Lang, javelin; Chuck Willing, pole vault; and Bill Nugent, Frank Martin, Mel Chelosky and Paul Smith, mile relay.

Stickmen Meet Middies; Bow to Swarthmore, 12-8

The Nittany Lion lacrosse team will play a return match with the U. S. Naval Academy tomorrow. The Annapolis team so far this season has been undefeated in college competition. In Penn State's last encounter with the Middies, the score was 20 to 0 in favor of Navy.

The Lions, bucking up against competition of their own class, bowed to Swarthmore College, Saturday, 12-8. The Lions were fighting all the way, according to Coach Thiel, and outscored the Garnet in the last half, 6-5. Lion goals were scored by Taylor, 4, Nolan, 2, and Hannum and Kerwin, 1 each.

"Our weakest play," the Lion mentor said, "was defensively and in handling ground balls, and due to our crude and inexperienced stickhandlers we were charged with no less than 10 penalties, during which time the enemy scored 6 times."

Coach Thiel will field practically the same starting lineup tomorrow as for the Swarthmore game, he announced today. Jack Nehoda, who played his best game against the Garnet, according to Coach Thiel, will open at the net. Dean Kissell will continue on inside de-

fense, flanked by Bronco Kosahovich and Navy trainee Savino Vesco, who will start for the injured Ed Bauer.

The rest of the team includes Taylor and Hannum, aided by an unnamed replacement for Navy trainee Mike Ciaramella, who became ineligible last week, at the attack posts, and Tom Smith, Jim Worley, and Navy trainee Nolan in midfield.

Johnny Deibler, co-captain of the 1944 track team will run the 400 meter run for the N. Y. Athletic Club in the national championships. Jim Rafferty, another ex-Lion will run with him.

Dave Pincus, 1994 Middle Atlantic AAU discus champion was also visiting at the Penn Relays in Merchant Marine uniform.
