

Lions Outrun Muhlenburg; Try Again in IC-4A Meet

Penn State's track team thor-oughly defeated Muhlenburg, 108 teams, neither of which will run to 18, Saturday, taking 13 out of in this meet. 14 possible first places. Tomorrow the Lion track team will face the best trackmen of other colleges in the IC-4A meet at West Point.

In Saturday's meet Bill Nugent and Bob Steed were both double winners. Nugent won the 440 yard dash in 51.2 seconds and the 220 in 23.2. Steed won the 120 high hurdles in 17.4 seconds and the 220 lows in 26.8 seconds.

Muhlenburg failed to place at all in the 220, 440, half mile, pole vault, and broad jump. Although many times and distances were not too good Saturday, the team will do better at the IC-4A meet


