 relieve the crowded plant situation. The most urgently needed buildings are an animal industries building to house animal husbandry and poultry husbandry, and a plant industries building to house agronomy and horticulture.
 "There will be a strong program of student counselling by designating special members of the faculty to act as personal advisors to the students. These faculty members will receive special training," Dean Fletcher said.
 Plans for increases in the scope of the curriculum are being made. Mr. Fletcher explains: "There is an urgent demand for a new curriculum in food technology with specialization in horticultural manufacturing, milling, baking and other food industries."
 Dean Fletcher expects an enrollment in the school of not less than 1500 students within the next year and a half. He also hopes for the revival of the Penn State Farmer, agricultural publication.

 contest. He was line coach at Rice Institute, Texas, and at the University of Florida prior to his return to the Lion team in 1929. Besides holding the position of line coach, he became head baseball coach in 1930, a position he has held for the last 15 years.
Leon Gajecki
 As a center, Leon J. Gajecki ranks with "Mother" Dunn and Larry Conover as one of the best turned out in the Nittany Valley. Besides being an outstanding lineman and line backer-up, he was an excellent student in fuel technology. The Colver griddle led the Lions to a great season in 1940 when they won six, tied one, and lost one, an upset to the Pitt Panthers. Gajecki was rugged, being a perennial 60 minute man. His play that year was reflected in being chosen on the NEA All-American aggregation and to play in the annual East-West classic in San Francisco.
 So the new season will start and eager fans will look for another Dunn, Higgins, Way, Kilingler, Bedenk, or Gajecki. Who knows, they may even find him.
