

Rabbi Lasker was educated at Tufts College and the University of Cincinnati. He did post-graduate work at the University of Cincinnati and the University of Chicago and was ordained by the Hebrew Union College where he received the Morgenthau Travelling Fellowship.

During 1929 and 1930 Rabbi Lasker made a study of Jewish Religious conditions in Poland. He organized the Liberal Movement of Reform Jewry in the Hague, Holland for the World Union of Progressive Judaism.




