

# Skinner Speaks On 'Top Secret'

"The Top Secret" will be the topic discussed by W. Sherman Skinner, co-pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Germantown, at Chapel services in Schwab Auditorium, 11 a.m. Sunday.

A member of a family which included three ministers, besides himself, the pastor was educated at Gouverneur High School, N. Y., and attended Princeton and Colgate Universities. He graduated from the latter in 1927 with the degree of B.A.

After receiving his Th. B. degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1939 and his Th.M. in 1931, Dr. Skinner studied in Germany at the Universities of Berlin and Marburg as a Fellow in New Testament Literature of Princeton University.

In 1941, he received the honorary degree of DD from Temple University. He is a trustee of Wilson College and of Beaver College and is also the director of the Philadelphia Federation of Churches.
