Auditorium, 11 a.m. Sunday.



After receiving his Th. B. degree from Princeton Theological Semimary in 1939 and his Th.M. in 1931, Dr. Skinner studied in Germany at the Universities of Berlin and Marbugh as a Fellow in New Testament Literature of Princeton University.

In 1941, he received the honorary degree of DD from Temple University. He is a trustee of Wilson College and of Beaver College and is also the director of the Philadelphia Federation of Churches.


Other statistics show that 1481 excuses were granted to students while only 180 were given in December, '1944.
