Key Captures 8 Offices; Nittany-Independents'

Vaughn Stapleton, Nittany-Independent, swept the AllCollege presidential elections this week with a count of 1383 votes, more than twice that of his Key opponent, Walter Falkenberg.

Stapleton's running mate, Rebecca Walker, captured the All-College secretary post, defeating June First, Key; by 226 pallots.

The Key party pulled through in the semester elections, however, by placing four presidents and four secretaries, as compared with three presidents and three secretaries for Nittany-Independent.

A total of 2,006 students voted in the elections Tuesday and Wernesday, which is approximately $40 \%$ of the student baly.
