

In a special session called by Governor Edward Martin, the Pennsylvania legislature voted unanimously in favor of establishing a branch State Liquor store in State College. The branch. store will be located in the basement of Engineering H.

There were many bids for the location of the "spirit dispensary"; the strongest coming from houses owned and operated by men's groups, fraternities. known locally as fraternities. Since, however, women students are restricted in visiting fraternities, it was decided that this location would be a more satisfactory choice.
