# 9 Liberal Arts Faculty Men Return

Nine members of the Liberal Arts faculty have returned to the College this semester after periods of military service or other war work. They are: M. Nelson McGeary, assistant professor of political science; Walter J. Harrington, professor of mathematics; George G. Lucas, instructor in economics; Thomas C. Benton, mathematics; Vito J. DiVincenzo, Spanish; Joseph J. Rubin, English composition; Donald B. King, assistant professor of English composition; Leo A. Bressler, instructor in English composition, and Phillip S. Klein, associate professor of American history.

**Professor McGeary**, who left for navy service in 1943, served with the Navy Military Government on Guam and also was stationed in Hawaii. Before he came to the College in 1939, he taught in the department of government at Columbia University. From April, 1944, to March, 1946, **W. J. Harrington** was a member of the Theoretical Ballistics Section of the Allegheny Ballistics Laboratory at Pinto, W. Va. of the Office of Scientific Research and Development, the laboratory handled projects for both Army and Navy, related to design, development, and testing of rockets. Dr. Harrington came to the College in 1941.

**George G. Lucas**, instructor in economics, returned last week to his duties after four years in the army, as an instructor in infantry tactics at Camp Robinson, Ark., and with the ASTP unit at the College. **Professor DiVincenzo** left the College in May, 1943, for Navy service. He was stationed at the Naval Air Station, San Juan, Porto Rico, as an educational services officer, teaching conversational Spanish to enlisted men and officers. Later he served in Washington, New York, and at the US Naval Hospital, Corona, Cal.

**Professor Rubin**, who left the College in 1943, served 26 months with the army in New Caledonia, New Zealand, Luzon, and with

the Sixth Army occupation troops in Japan. As military historian, he wrote combat narratives of the Solomon campaign and medical history of the South Pacific for War Department records.

**Professor King**, who is also skiing coach, taught English composition here for two years before entering the navy in October, 1943. Stationed mostly in Corpus Christi, Texas, as a Naval Air Corps aerology officer, he also spent four months studying Japanese at an oriental languages school in Oklahoma.

**Leo A. Bressler**, instructor in English composition, left the College in May, 1943, and saw navy service in New Guinea, Hawaii, Philippines, Tarawa, the Marshalls, Tinian, and Saipan. He came to the College in 1937.

**Dr. Klein**, who left the College in December, 1942, served as air-

craft ground training officer at the Naval Air Station, Trinidad, British West Indies for two years, was stationed at Cecil Field, Fla., and served as historical officer on the staff of Admiral Royal E. Ingersoll, commander of the western sea frontier.
