During March of last year 2948 calls were totalled in the dispensary while 2222 were recorded during the past month. Of this latter number 91 were Navy sick calls while 2131 are regular college students.

A lesser decrease was noted in the inflinmary as 85 patients were treated as compared to 76 this year. The amount of 245 bed days were spent by students last year and only 231 this year.
