

Students, Faculty To Contribute To Paul Smith Memorial Fund

A campus drive to solicit student and faculty contributions towards a Paul H. Smith Memorial Trophy gets underway today, according to Arthur Goldberg, chairman of the memorial drive.

Letters of solicitation have been sent to fraternities, sororities, and independent houses, asking them to contribute towards the campaign, and there are also drive solicitors who will collect contributions, the chairman stated.

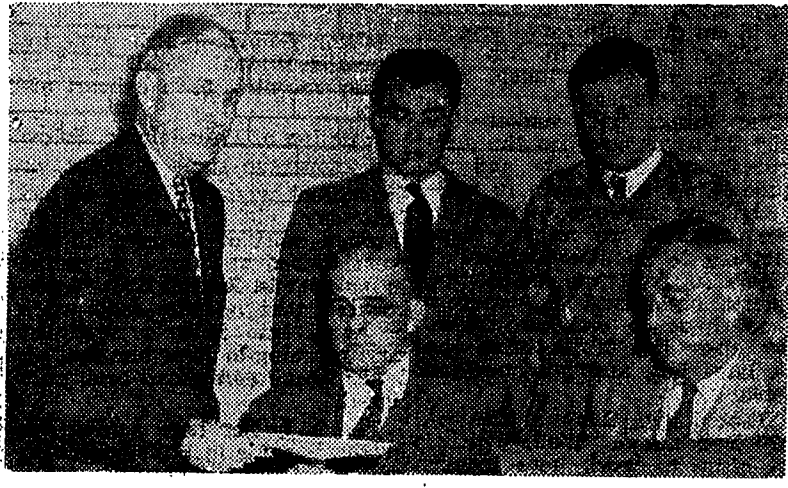
Chairman Goldberg announced that all contributions to the Smitty Memorial should be sent or left at Student Union, in care of All-College President Vaughn Stapleton, or given to any of the following drive solicitors: Chairman Goldberg, Leo Kornfeld, Dick Lose, Marvin Mangus, Dick McAdams, or Bob Graham, of Graham and Sons.

The Memorial idea was set in motion by Chairman Goldberg, head manager of the boxing team, soon after the sudden death of the former captain of the boxing team March 24.

The proposed Memorial is a large, engraved gold trophy which would be placed in a special trophy case in Recreation Hall. A small edition of the larger trophy will be awarded annually to an outstanding Lion boxer, or student.

An all-around student may be chosen for the honor, however, as the Frank J. Goodman trophy is awarded annually to the most outstanding senior on the Nittany Lion boxing team.

"I believe a Paul Smith Memorial is a fine gesture on the part of the Penn State student body," Smitty's former ring coach, Leo

Houck, stated. "Paul Smith was a very fine boy, a good athlete, and a gentleman."

The sentiments of all those who knew Smitty, his teachers and friends, might best be voiced by Chairman Goldberg, who said:

"The time that an athlete spends in preparation and training for an athletic event is great. Smitty spent a great amount of his time in preparing for his athletic encounters at Penn State."

"I feel that it is altogether fitting that the members of an institution, students and teachers alike, for which he fought and ran should leave some monument so that his memory can be prolonged in the minds and thoughts of Penn State's to come."

U of P Gives Fellowship To Sociology Professor

Professor Edward Abramson of the sociology department has been awarded a George Leib Harrison Fellowship in Sociology by the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences of the University of Pennsylvania, according to an announcement by Dr. Edwin B. Williams, dean of the School.

The award provides a stipend of \$600 and free tuition in the Graduate School at Pennsylvania for the academic year 1946-47. This honor is one of 64 fellowship and scholarship awards made by the Graduate School for the coming academic year. They are shared by men and women from 17 states and a number of foreign countries.

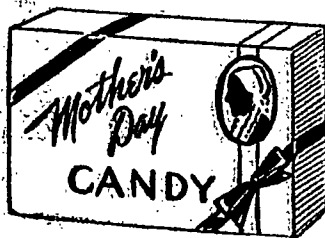
