Dr. Wilbur H. Cramblet, president of Bethany College and a nationally known leader in fraternity affairs, will address a combined meeting of fraternity presidents and advisors at an informal banquet in the State College Hotel banquet room at 6 p.m. Thursday.

Sponsored by the Interfraternity Council and the Association of Fraternity Counselors, the banquet will be attended by two representatives of each fraternity, an undergraduate, and the fraternity advisor.

The speaker, who will be introduced by Dean of Men Arthur R. Warnock, will discuss the prospects and problems of today's fraternities. A general discussion will follow his talk, led by Prof. Mummel Fishburn.

Dr. Cramblet is national president of Alpha Sigma Phi and is secretary of the National Interfraternity Conference. A graduate of Bethany College, he received his M. A. and Ph.D from Yale. He has been president of Bethany College since 1934.

the sophomore year. Each scholarship will be for \$250 a year; selection of recipients will be in the hands of the executive committee of the School of Mineral Industries.

A scholarship fund will be created also with \$22,678.84 in the Memorial Endowment Fund of the Class of 1920. The awards will provide scholarships in the

amount of \$100 each, "as equally as possible" between juniors and seniors, on the basis of scholarship, activities, character, Americanism, and financial need.

The board also voted to accept from the class graduating on February 28, 1946, the money accumulated in the damage fund to be used as a class gift toward the completion of the mural in Old Main.
