

Brunner Elected Trustee For Lingnan University

Honors and jobs come thick and fast to Dr. Henry S. Brunner, head of the department of agricultural education. Announcement was made recently that Dr. Brunner has been elected a member of the board of American Trustees for Lingnan University in China, and named one of three educators to evaluate 400 vocational agriculture units in rural high schools of the United States.

His re-election as chairman of the Penn-State-in-China committee and his election to the Board of Directors of the Penn State Christian Association was announced Tuesday.

Succeeds Watts
As a member of the American board of trustees for Lingnan, Dr. Brunner succeeds R. L. Watts, dean emeritus of the School of Agriculture. According to Dr. Brunner, the primary responsibility of the American board is to supply the American faculty, many of whom have been detained in this country on account of the war.

Dr. Brunner, a member of the National Committee on Standards in Agricultural Education, was appointed for the rural study by the Office of Education in Washington, D. C. Collaborating with him will be Dr. George Devoe of Michigan State College, and Dr. Frank Lathrop of the research staff of the U. S. Office of Education.

As a board member of the American Trustees for Lingnan, Dr. Brunner's position will be closely associated with his duties as chairman of the Penn-State-in-China committee. This committee helps to support Lingnan financially, while the American Board of Trustees has administrative responsibility.

Need Great
In relating the need for financial help for Lingnan University, Dr. Brunner said:

"The need is great. Even with war losses of thirty percent of the library, half of the scientific equipment, virtually all furniture, and damage to the buildings representing thousands of dollars, the University has a greater enrollment than ever before—796 college and 450 middle school

students. "Our obligation becomes all the more poignant in the light of the reasons for this enrollment—partly the accumulation from years of no opportunity at all, and partly the fact that Hong Kong and Sun Yat Sen Universities are so shattered as to be unable to open for a long period." Dr. Brunner said that the loyalty, courage, and perseverance of all the Christian colleges of China during the suffering and horrors of the war have created a significant impression upon the minds of the Chinese people; this promises to be a notable element in the making of a new and modern China.

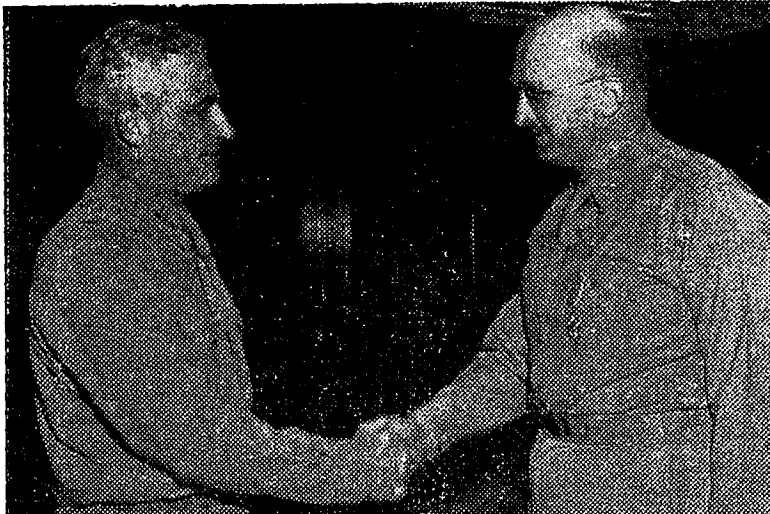
