Included in the number are 163 men who were enrolled as Navy ROTY trainees on an active duty basis, and who will return as civilians in the Fall. Of the 190 trainees here this semester, 10 received degrees Thursday.

¹ Six additional trainees were among the ten men to receive reserve commissions so that all but 11 of the men who will be discharged this month, and did not receive their degrees, plan to regişler in September.

Of the 4119 undergraduates returning, 2496 are men and 1623 are women students. Two hundred and four students returning are registered in the Graduate School; 34 as full-time special students; and 20 in the transition section.

The break-down by schools follows: Agriculture, 527; Chemistry and Physics, 392; Education, 593; Engineering, 740; the Liberal Arts, 1517; Mineral, Industries, 158; and Physical Education and Athletics, 182.
