Penn State freshmen will not appear in College sports during the forthcoming school year.

This change came when College officials ruled that only prewar students with upperclass rating would be admitted to campus in the Fall.

While the first-year students will be admitted to Penn State, they will be assigned to other institutions as freshmen-in-waiting. They will not be eligible for College sports until their soph-

omore year.
Football Coach Bob Higgins and other Lion mentors dislike the change because it takes away one of their most valuable sources of material and also deprives freshmen of a year's prepping under varsity coaches.

Since 1942, when freshman rules were relaxed for the duration, first year players have dominated the Penn State sports

In football, freshmen were represented by Larry Joe, Joe Colone, Bobby Williams, Johnny Chuckran, Elwood Petchel, Sam Tamburo, Bronco Kosanovich, Chuck Drazenovich, Joe Tepsic and a variety of others.

The same was true of other sports, freshmen building the foundations of the College's athletic teams.

State Sen. Elmer J. Holland told the delegates that the only way they could impress politicians was by registering and voting.


Telegrams urging the rejection of the revived OPA bill and requesting extension of old price control regulations were sent to President Truman and all Penn-sylvania Congressmen.


The conference voted to join in state-wide buying strike and delegates were urged to lead the fight against inflation in their home communities.
