Bollman Talks At Vespers

"Deep River" will be the topic of the sermon delivered by Dr. William H. Bollman in Schwab Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. Sunday.

Dr. Bollman was born in Buffalo, N. Y., and was graduated from the Missions House College in 1917. He received his B. D. from the Theological Seminary of the Reformed Church in Lancaster, and later did graduate work at Lehigh University.

The minister received his doctor of divinity degree from Franklin and Marshall College and was ordained minister of the Reformed Church in 1920.

Dr. Bollman has held ministerial positions in New Brunswick, N. J., Bethlehem, and has been pastor at the Lancaster church since 1932. At present, he is a member of the Board of Ministerial Pensions and Relief, Rotary, Masons, and Phi Kappa Sigma.
