Before they are eligible, however, they must plan to spend two extra semesters here in order that they can complete the eight semesters of NROTC

Ex-NROTCers Expected The classes for the Fall semester, Capt. Approximately 100 of these students who formerly were enrolled at the College are expected to re-

urn. 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
