tered room accommodations with the OPA by October 15 are breaking the present rent control law," warned Kurt Schumacher, OPA Rent Control Administrator from Williams part in a speech spon-Williamsport, in a speech spon-sored by the Common Sense Club and the American Veterans' Committee Tuesday night.

Before an audience of townspeople as well as students Mr. Schumacher said, "My job is to enforce rent regulations, and your job is to co-operate. Together we can do the very thing rent control is meant to do, that is, to sta-bilize rents and thereby prevent inflation, and to prevent unnecessary eviction."
"Close to 4000 registrations have

a ready been made by landlords of Centre County," he said. "Those who have not registered by October 15 are subject to \$5000 fine and imprisonment."

"Every tenant should have received a copy of the landlord's registration, if he is living anywhere other than a rooming house," the OPA administrator explained further. "This registration shows the maximum rent that may be charged for such an accommodation. If the rent is higher than that of January 1, 1946, or if the tenant has never received the registration report from his landlord, he should report it to the OPA office in Williamsport," he said.

He said that the whole prob-lem should be sent to the council of foreign ministers, with a re-quest that the Big Four find a

solution.
The Yugoslav delegate also accused the United States and Britain of betraying the Big Four agreement on Trieste in order to establish an Anglo-American military base on the Adriatic.
