

Strong Penn State Soccer Team To Meet Gettysburg Tomorrow

Penn State's soccer squad, strongest since 1942, will have its first test of the 1946 season when the Lions tangle with Gettysburg on the baseball field 1:30 p.m. tomorrow afternoon.

Coach Bill Jeffrey begins his 21st season as the Lion soccer mentor with a record surpassed by no other collegiate team in the country. His 103 wins with 15 losses and 21 ties include a string of 65 consecutive games without defeat over an eight year period.

The booters have been going through daily practice sessions for the past few weeks in preparation for their season opener. Although the game will be in progress when the Penn State-Bucknell football tussle gets under way, fans in the East stands will be able to watch the booters between intervals of the gridiron game.

Starting Lineup

Starting line-up for Saturday's game will find 1944 All-American Gene Graebner defending the lion goal. Bill Dietrich or Jim Kline will be at the right fullback post, with Lloyd Black getting the nod for starting at left fullback.

All-American Dean Hartman is back at his right halfback spot, with Tim Petroff probably getting the nod over Jess Hartman for the center halfback position. Boyd Ethers has been slated to start at left halfback.

Hamilton Shifted

Paul Bender begins at outside right with team captain and 1945 All-American left halfback Hamilton being shifted to inside right for more effective playing.

Ken Hosterman starts at center, and Dean Witmer at inside left. Hackman or Don Rider will be at the outside left position. Game official is James Walter from Philadelphia.

Bucknell will be the Lions' opponent next week, with Colgate, Navy, Cornell, Syracuse, Army, Temple, and Pennsylvania completing the season's schedule.

 "Bucknell has always been a very tough opponent and they would be satisfied to lose every game on their schedule if they could have the pleasure of beating Penn State," said Bob Higgins yesterday. "We're going to have to keep on our toes every minute of the game if we want to win."

Coach Al Humphreys warned his Thundering Herd that Penn State will be even tougher than Cornell. They're bigger, more experienced, and nearly every man on the State roster is familiar with the Higgins style of play.

Humphreys has strengthened his line by moving Johnny Watkins from end to tackle and converting Bill Doebler from fullback to the other tackle spot. Watkins played back, end, and finally guard last season while Doebler was a halfback during the fall of 1943.

Cheerleaders will be on hand for the opening game of the season. They include head cheerleader Hal Benjamin, Bill Bonsell, Marge Dunmire, Stan Eisman, Robert Frankhouse, Billie Grove, Ginny Gallop, Betsy Heagy, Bill Krouse, Jim Mitchell, and Claire Robinson.

In the Penn State backfield, pint-sized Bobby Williams will start at tailback. Bobby, who was the outstanding passer on the 1942 eleven, proved himself a triple-threat back during the scrimmage with Penn last week.


At fullback will be Joe Colone who was one of the nation's top punters while a freshman on the 1942 squad. Manny Weaver, hard-driving blocking back in 1940, is back at the quarterback slot. At wingback will be Bob Urion who played for Higgins in 1944 while serving in the V-12 program.
