Seventy-three students were accepted from among those who tried out last week for construction, stage crew, properties, lighting, scenery, makeup and costume design. Of the 45 girls who reported for dancing, 20 were accepted.

"Thespians need more men for the chorus," Mellott said. "So far, 12 have been accepted. We want any interested candidates to come to the first dance rehearsal in Schwab auditorium, 7 p.m., tomorrow."

Six women and four men have been chosen for vocal parts from the 28 candidates. Eight men reported for the job of understudying the Stooges. The name of the Fourth Stooge will be announced later, Mellott said. Many of those who tried out were members of last spring's Thespian cast.
