

Lions Trample Bisons, 48-6

Petchel, Joe, Tamburo Share Scoring Honors

Sparked by Joe Colone, Bobby Williams, and Elwood Petchel, Penn State opened its 1946 football season last Saturday by whipping Bucknell 48-6 before a crowd of 14,000.

A stubborn and determined Bison eleven held the Nittany Lions scoreless until the last two and a half minutes of the first half when Petchel passed to Tamburo who scored from the Bucknell 15. The touchdown climaxed a drive from the State 30-yard line led by Bob Urion and Bob Weitzel.

With less than a minute left in the half, Fred Bell charged into the Bison backfield to recover Hubka's attempted lateral. Petchel raced around the right side 11 yards for a touchdown as the half ended. "Automatic" Ed Czekaj converted.

62-Yard Drive

Starting the second half on the Penn State 13, Williams and Colone alternated with Jeff Durkota to drive all the way to Bucknell's 5. Larry Joe then made his first appearance and outraced three Bisons around right end for the third tally.

After the Herd made their only score following a State pass interference penalty, the Lions began to march. Joe took Kochin's kick-off on his 4-yard line and ran it back to the 41. On the next play Joe with beautiful blocking raced through the bewildered Bucknell team for 59 yards to a touchdown. **Suhey Intercepts.**

Two plays after the Lions' kick-off, Steve Suhey, 210-pound guard, intercepted a Bison pass and raced 40 yards before he was stopped. The play was called back because of a clipping penalty. Petchel then went on to tally the fifth and sixth State touchdowns.

After Taccalozzi's kick-off, Stasko fumbled and tackle John Finley recovered for the Higginsmen on the Bucknell 7. Larry Joe then went around the weak side of the line for the Lions' final touchdown. Thus, after playing only about three minutes in the entire game, Joe carried the ball five times, made a total of 112 yards, and scored three touchdowns.

Soon thereafter Witmer took a pass from Paul Bender and scored the Lions' second marker.

The Blue and White squad was unable to penetrate Gettysburg's goal during the second and third periods, but the Lions continually maintained the offensive. Shortly after the final quarter began, Hamilton tallied one from the right side of the field and Witmer followed suit when he scored the fourth goal of the game for the Nittany Lions. Hackman completed the scoring with a goal two minutes before the tussle ended.
