A stubborn and determined Bison eleven held the Nittany Lions scoreless until the last two and a half minutes of the first half when Petchel passed to Tamburo who scored from the Bucknell 15. The touchdown climaxed a drive from the State 30-yard line led by Rob Urion and Bob Weitzel.

With less than a minute left in the half, Fred Bell charged into the Bison backfield to recover Jubka's attempted lateral. Petchel raced around the right side 11 yards for a touchdown as the half ended. "Automatic" Ed Czekaj converted.



Mat Tryouts Today




