

Ski Club Plans Outing at Trail

Penns Valley Ski Club, member of the newly-formed Pennsylvania Ski Federation, will conduct a weekend outing and work party at the club's ski trail near Boalsburg Saturday afternoon and Sunday.

Bob Dunlap, chairman of the club's Slopes committee, announced last night that everyone—students, faculty, and townspeople—interested in skiing are cordially invited. Those that can, are requested to bring pioneering equipment such as axes, brush clippers, and shovels.

"A ski supper will be served Sunday evening at the Ski Lodge," Dunlap said, and those interested may make reservations by contacting Dunlap or by signing the list at Student Union in Old Main.

Approximately 25 overnight guests can be accommodated in the lean-tos at the trail. Persons desiring to remain there Saturday night may so indicate on the sign-up list. Kitchen utensils will be provided for those cooking their own food Saturday night and Sunday morning.

Lion Soccermen Practice Teamwork

Inclement weather cut short soccer practice yesterday, but Coach Bill Jeffrey continued to stress teamwork among his booters in preparation for the Bucknell game on New Beaver Field Saturday.

After disposing of Gettysburg without too much difficulty last week, the Lions are looking forward to their second victory of the season. However, stiffer opposition is expected from the Bisons.

Return of Cooper, Lion booter from the 1945 squad, strengthens the Blue and White roster. The same starting line-up will probably begin Saturday, with Cooper being expected to substitute frequently, according to Coach Jeffrey.

Bucknell, as usual, will attempt to upset the Penn Staters. Indications are that the Bisons will field a good squad, with former Nittany performer Rodriguez leading Bucknell's attack.

Recent Lion practice sessions have included kicking from the 18-yard stripe, for the Jeffrey men over-played the closer boots from the 12-yard marker in the Gettysburg tussle.

Diamond Star Lauded

John Montgomery Ward, whose name has been added to Baseball's Hall of Fame honor list, is credited with helping organize Penn State's first official baseball team in 1875. He also was recognized as one of the game's first curve ball pitchers.
