

Jeffreyemen Down Colgate Raiders

Three goals by 1945 All-American and team captain Johnny Hamilton paved the way for a 5-1 Lion victory over a hard fighting Colgate soccer eleven. The victory was the third straight for the Jeffreyemen this season, and the first game in which an opponent had tallied against the Blue and White.

Initial score of the game came midway in the opening period when Hamilton, on a pass from Witmer, booted a long, fast shot that zipped past the heavily defended Red Raider goal. Up to that time the visitors were giving the Lions a tough battle.

Hackman Tallies

Hackman followed a few minutes later on a pass from Bender to record Penn State's second marker. Then Hamilton came through in the remaining minutes of the period with a shot from center to make the score 3-0.

Ken Hosterman, Lion center forward, added another point to the Lion score sheet when he put one

in soon after the second quarter began. Colgate Scores On a "use of hands" penalty

kick, Colgate scored their only tally late in the first half. This marked the first time the Jeffreyemen had been scored upon this

year. Raide, Vanderweghe made good the kick. The Blue and White was able to bottle up Colgate the rest of the

game. Hamilton scored his third goal early in the third period. Neither side did any damage the final quarter.

One Penn State team played in the Rose Bowl in 1919 and four players gained All American honors. One of these was Robert Higgins, captain of the 1919 team and now head football coach.
