

# Lions Journey to Colgate To Break Series Deadlock

It will be the double wing against a single wing formation when the Nittany Lions journey to meet Colgate at Hamilton N. Y. on Saturday.

For all but one game in the nine previous gridiron meetings, Red Raider coach Andy Kerr and Bob Higgins have been opposing coaches.

Both will be out to win with the series deadlocked at four wins each and a tie. The Lions have beaten or tied Colgate every year since 1941.

The two coaches have much in

common, with a Kerr a devout disciple of the double wing attack, while Higgins has remained one of the East's major devotees of the single wing.

### Longest Tenure

Kerr, in his 18th season at Colgate, is the only coach in the East who has enjoyed a longer tenure in his present job than the "Hig". It is rumored that Kerr will retire at the end of the present season.

Not only are the opposing coaches familiar with each others strategy but the same is true of many of the players on both teams. Among the 13 present Colgate players who have previously faced the Lions, seven will be in the starting lineup, and a similar ratio holds true for Penn State.

Some of the Lion veterans, however, may not be available for Saturday's invasion.

### Injuries Handicap

Larry Joe, who suffered a shoulder separation in the Michigan State game, won't be ready to play for a month or more.

Red Moore, captain and tackle, aggravated his ankle injury, and also may be withheld from the Colgate fray. Injured legs are hampering Guard Steve Suhny and Tailback Elwood Petchel, while

# Wright Heads Fuel Conference

Dr. C. C. Wright, professor of fuel technology of the Mineral Industries School, will act as chairman of the Joint Fuels Conference of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers to be held in Philadelphia, October 25 and 26. Combustion, mining practices, and mineral preparation will be discussed.

Several members of the Mineral Industries staff will attend the conference, at which Dr. A. W. Gauger, director of the Mineral Industries Experiment Station, will present the Nichol's Award to Dr. Fiebaer of the U. S. Bureau of Mines in recognition for outstanding work in the fuel field.

The Mineral Industries School has recently compiled a manual outlining modern developments in various phases of efficient heating and construction.

Modern housing needs and methods of construction, basic elements of heating, recent developments in domestic stokers, advances in heating equipment, engineering and research developments and trends in merchandising are all extensively covered in the publication.
