## Political Slates Mystify Students In History Classes

Student knowledge of state and national political candidates is very slight if two history 21 classes are a reliable cross section. Only 10% of the 93 students polled knew the four major-party candidates for Pennsylvania governor and U. S. Senator, while one third did not know even one. Among the 38 voting students, however, the knowledge was a little higher, with nearly a fifth knowing both slates and another fifth returning blanks. The average voter knew two candidates; the non-voting average was one.
