

# Houck To Teach High School Boxing

## Lion Coach To Serve As Clinic Instructor

Leo Houck, Penn State's boxing coach, will be instructor for the series of high school boxing clinics planned this fall by the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association.

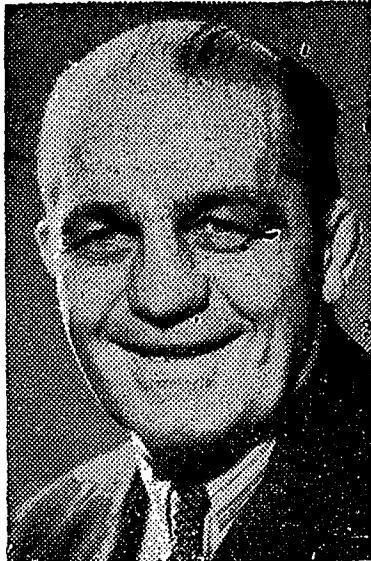
Clinics have been tentatively booked for six cities, opening at Scranton November 21, with others to follow at Allentown November 22, Harrisburg November 29, Upper Darby November 30, Erie December 7, and Jeannette December 14.

Boxing fundamentals, equipment and officiating will be stressed in the forthcoming clinics with P.I.A.A. district officials presiding at each session. Night sessions are planned at Scranton, Allentown and Harrisburg, with afternoon sessions at Upper Darby, Erie and Jeannette. Demonstration bouts are also planned.

Houck, a Lancaster native who will field his 25th team at Penn State this winter, long has been an advocate of high school boxing and strongly urged the reestablishment of clinics as a forerunner of interscholastic competition.

The P.I.A.A. of which Edmund P. Wicht is executive secretary, and the Penn State School of Physical Education and Athletics, of which Dr. Carl P. Schott is the director, are co-sponsors of the project.

## Penn State's Record

Penn State's three fall teams—the gridgers, booters, and harriers boast of impressive records so far this season.

The Lion pigskin squad downed Bucknell 48-6 in their opener, "quick-kicked" a victory over Syracuse 9-0, dropped a close one to Michigan State during the Homecoming, 19-16, and then bounced back into the win column last Saturday with a 6-2 victory over Colgate.

Coach Jeffrey's record includes three wins and a tie. After white-washing Gettysburg 5-0 and Bucknell 7-0, the soccer men took over Colgate 5-1. Last week the Nitany squad tied the Middies after Navy scored their tally on a "fluke" kick in the final period.

Chick Werner's harriers claim three victories over opponents Syracuse 15-40, Michigan State 25-30, and Cornell 15-40.

The gridiron classic and the cross-country meet will be on home grounds as the Higginsmen tangle with Fordham and the harriers compete against undefeated Pitt. The soccer men travel to Ithaca, N. Y. to tussle with Cornell.

The meet will start ten minutes before the intermission of the Penn State-Fordham football game.

Captaining the Lion harriers will be Don "Pop" Longenecker—dubbed "Pop" by his teammates because of his age. Longenecker is a 28-year old ex-GI who last fall, as a freshman, came out for indoor track just to keep his fraternity brother company.

Longenecker received his letter in track last spring, and is considered as one of the top-notch performers on the team.

Whether Gerry Karver will run in Saturday's meet is still a question. Karver has placed first in every cross-country meet this season and is considered one of the outstanding runners on the squad.

Werner will select seven runners for the meet with Pitt. They will be chosen from Captain Don Longenecker, Gerry Karver, Curt Stone, Horace Ashenfelter, Howie Horne, Mitch Williams, Fred Lennox, Bob Auman, Tony Vigilante, Bill Wills, and Tink Candy.
