SYRACUSE RECORD

Syracuse, coached for 21 seasons by Art Horrocks, will come to State with a 2 and 2 record. The New Yorkers won their op-ener from Cornell, 2-1, in the last few seconds of the game.

Cortland downed the Orangemen 6-3, and Colgate repeated the performance in a bitterly contes'cd 2-1 tussle that nearly caused a riot at Hamilton. Last Seturday the Horrocksmen bounced back into the win column with a 4-1 triumph over Ithaca College.

The visitors, with only three veteran players on the roster, are completing Their first schedule since 1942. No Orange team was fielded during the war years of 1943, 1944 and 1945.
