Galbraith Asks Vets To Check Records

All veterans are advised to come to 109A Old Main before the holidays to complete their records, said Robert E. Galbraith, veteran's counselor.

Failure to record marital status, claim file number, home and college address, age, branch and length of service, and curriculum is delaying many veterans from receiving various benefits.

Under the "Kunkle Fund" 20 students have been granted loans this semester. This fund was provided by a vice-president of General Motors to finance loans up to \$150, a semester to married student veterans who are unable to get along on their earnings or who need hospitalization.

Veteran's records will also be used in compiling the new Penn State History of World War II, Galbraith said.
