

Susquehanna Bows 57-33 As Lion Cagers Look To Hoyas

In a tune-up for tomorrow's tussle with a tough Georgetown live in Washington, Penn State's cagers rolled over Susquehanna Wednesday night to the tune of 57-33. Jack Biery, pre-war 1942-43 scoring ace, paced the victory—the first of the season for the Lawthermen—with 25 points.

Susquehanna never seriously threatened as the Lions outscored the boys from Selinsgrove in each but the final quarter. Hornstein, elongated pivot man, was second to Biery in scoring for Penn State with 11 points while Hospoder led with 15 counters for the losers.

ZIP VERSUS ZONE

In tomorrow's contest with the Hoyas it will be the speed of the Capitol quintet versus the tricky sliding zone defense of the Lawther-coached five as the Lions seek to upset a highly touted Georgetown team.

The starting squad for the Nittany Lions will remain unchanged from the Susquehanna encounter with Dave Hornstein at center, Jack Biery and Milt Simon at the forward positions and Jim Lawther and Johnny Rusinko at guard.

Taking the court for Coach Elmer Ripley will be Danny Krause, Ed Brembs and Ray Corley—all of whom he recently stated would have good chances for All-American mention this season. Brembs played as a freshman for Fordham while Corley had experience under Ripley last year on his top-notch Notre Dame five. The other two Hoya starters are Andy Kosticka and Miggs Reilly, both hold-overs from the 1942-43 team that split two decisions with the Nittany Lions but went on to take the Eastern division championship in the NCAA competition.

Kosticka, incidentally, according to Coach Lawther, was General Douglas MacArthur's Russian interpreter during the war. But he may need more than Russian to interpret Lawther's zone defense tomorrow.
