## Lions Score Upset In Last-Minute Surge

outdone, however, the Hoyas knotted it up once more at 37-37. With less than a minute to play, Biery dropped a foul shot to give Penn State a one-point advantage. Desperately, the Hoyas took the ball and passed down the court, but lost it out of bounds. On a quick break, Biery took the ball once more, racing down the court for the shot that broke Georgetown's back and gave Penn State the game 40-37.

While Biery starred on offense, Johnny Rusinko and Jim Lawther were outstanding on defense. With Coach Lawther's sliding zone defense working to perfection, the two guards were continuously grabbing the ball from the backboards on rebounds to break up the Georgetown offense and shoot the ball up to the Lion forwards. Rusinko was forced from the game on fouls with only seconds remaining, but not before he had done much damage to the Hoya chances for victory with his stellar defensive play and the 10 points he registered on field goals.

### Biery Sparks Offense

Jack Biery again led the scoring with 14 points, to add to the 25 he racked up against Susquehanna to give him a 39-point total for two games. Georgetown seemed to lack a defense for Biery's accurate one-handed shots from side-court.

Rusinko was second to Biery for the Nittany Lions with 10 points while Kostecka and Potolicchio shared the honors for the losers with 13 points apiece.

This week's games find the Lions tangling with the Bucknell Bison court team at Lewisburg tomorrow night, then returning to Rec Hall for the first home contest of the season Saturday night at 7 o'clock.

Michigan State's gridirers have named Joe Colone as fullback on their 1946 all-opponent football team which is composed of players from every section of the country.

The Spartans chose Steve Suhey as left guard on the second team.

For the second consecutive year, Bob Rutkowski was chosen to one of the guard posts of the Associated Press' All-State eleven. The rangy guard from Natrona was the only repeater from last year's team.

Nittany Lion high scorer Elwood Petchel was named along with tackle and team captain Red Moore for the second team while Joe Colone was picked for the fullback post on the third team.

Receiving honorable mention were ends Ed Czeka and Johnny Patskan, tackle John Nolan, guards Leo Nobile and Steve Suhey, center Bronco Kosanovich, and backs Larry Joe and Bobby Williams.

Lion coach Bob Higgins ranked 33rd in the nation in a poll of coaches conducted by the Scripps Howard newspapers in which Red Blaik, mentor of the unbeaten Army squad, was named "Coach of the Year."

After 13 years as head coach of Michigan State's football forces, Charlie Bachman announced his resignation at the Spartan football dinner on Friday.

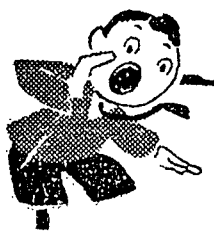
